

Service/Companion Animals

Service and Emotional Support Animals <u>are not</u> the same thing and rights of protection are covered under different entities. The new ADA rules define "service animal" as "any dog that is individually trained for an intellectual or mental disability." Service Animals are professionally trained to help people with disabilities by performing a certain task such as seeing, hearing or mobility assistance. Service animals are covered under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and are allowed at all public locations.

Emotional support animals require no special training beyond that of a well-behaved pet but are legally NOT pets and are for assisting people who have mental health or emotional disabilities or who have emotional components to serious physical conditions. Emotional Support Animals (ESAs) are not the same as Service Dogs. ESAs are therapeutic pets, usually prescribed by a therapist, psychiatrist or doctor that helps a disabled person with emotional difficulties or with loneliness. They may include various types of animals.

Under the US Federal Laws, Emotional Support Animals (ESAs) cannot go into no-pets-allowed places, BUT THEY ARE ALLOWED to live in "no-pet" housing and in the cabins of airplanes when accompanied by a note from their handler's doctor.

The ADA does not cover housing. If you need a Service Animal or Companion Animal where you live, it will fall under the Fair Housing Act.
