

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

## **REALIZATION OF A DREAM** - By Trish Cottrell

When I interviewed as a Bachelor of Social Work student intern in Spring of 2018, I asked TCIL's executive director, Ms. Donalyn Sjostrand, if there were plans to open a Del Norte County office in Crescent City, and she said the idea was being explored. Following graduation in May 2019, I was hired as a part-time Independent Living Specialist (ILS), and the weekly trips to Crescent City with Mari Dorenstreich, ILS/Program Coordinator, soon began. Five months later, the TCIL-Del Norte office was open every Thursday and Friday in the Del Norte Senior Center.

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Expansion Project (NEP) was born. With the guidance of our new executive director, Eddie Morgan, the goal was to find a larger office space that could be open full-time. Now my schooling is behind me and the NEP has successfully been completed with Sequoia Commins, ILS, available in our new office five days a week.

TCIL exists to promote the philosophy of independent living, to connect individuals with services, and work to create an accessible community, so that people with disabilities can have control over their lives and full access to the communities in which they live. While this Project was a long-time dream of mine, it was only fulfilled because our agency works as a team to develop and meet the goals of its staff, much in the same

way as we do each day for those who come through our doors.



## **New Legislation**

SB 1338, as amended, Umberg. Community Assistance, Recovery, and Empowerment (CARE) Court Program.

What will the bill do:

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specified persons to petition a civil court to create a voluntary CARE agreement or a court-ordered CARE plan and implement services, to be provided by county behavioral health agencies, to provide behavioral health care, including stabilization medication, housing, and other enumerated services to adults who are suffering from schizophrenia spectrum and psychotic disorders and who meet other specified criteria.



# IT'S AS EASY AS 1,2,3!

- CHECK YOUR ELIGIBILITY. Review the complete list of qualifying conditions/ machines available at pge.com/ medicalbaseline and work with a qualified medical practitioner to certify that a full-time resident in your home requires use of qualifying medical devices (or has specific heating/ cooling needs) to treat ongoing medical conditions. Note, eligibility for Medical Baseline is based on medical conditions or needs, NOT on income.
- VISIT pge.com/medicalbaseline to download and print the Medical Baseline Program application form or call 1-800-743-5000 and ask to have one mailed to you.
- COMPLETE AND SIGN Part A of the Medical Baseline Program application form, including your preferred contact method, and make sure Part B is completed and signed by a qualified medical practitioner. Then, mail it in to:

# WILL YOU NEED EXTRA HELP DURING A POWER SHUTOFF?

If you or someone you know has a disability or additional special needs, the California Foundation for Independent Living Centers can help you during a PSPS. For more information please visit disabilitydisasteraccess.org.

Due to COVID-19 shelter-in-place requirements and changing medical practitioner priorities, PG&E customers can self-certify their eligibility to enroll in the Medical Baseline program. Signature by a qualified medical practitioner is not required to apply but may be required to remain on the program beyond one year.

#### **NOTE FOR MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS**

A licensed physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant or person licensed pursuant to the Osteopathic Initiative Act, may certify a patient's eligibility as having a life-threatening condition or illness for the Medical Baseline Program. This program is not connected to any other medical assistance program like Medicare or Medi-Cal and only provides a lower energy rate from PG&E and extra notifications during a PSPS. **Social Security**: For all your questions related to Social Security Disability Benefits, Supplemental Security Income, Reconsideration and Appeals, Overpayments, Work Incentives while receiving Social
